Trudy Boulter has been a burn therapist for over 33 years and an American Burn Association member for the last 31 of those years. She has spent her entire career working in burns at the Children's Hospital of Colorado. During this thirty-year span, Trudy has been a constant- providing exceptional burn care at every level of need for the children who require her comprehensive experience and expertise.

Trudy graduated in 1986 with a Bachelor of Science in Occupational Therapy and a Minor in Human Development and Anatomy from Colorado State University in Ft. Collins, CO. Trudy was

offered a staff OT position at Children's Hospital and took a role on the home care Pediatric team in 1987. During the next subsequent years, Trudy ascended through numerous roles at Children's Hospital including Rehabilitation Team Leader; Burn Camp Rehabilitation Team Leader; Clinical Advanced Practice Leader and to her current role since 2009 as Burn Camp Director.
